Variety & Classification	Size	Ripening Time May-August	Pollination Blueberries described as self-pollinating will produce larger yields with cross pollination.	Fruit and Other Notes
Biloxi <i>Southern Highbush</i>	4-6ft tall x 3-6 ft wide	Mid Season	Needs pollination. Use Misty as a pollinator.	Very firm, light blue berries with excellent flavor.
Misty <i>Southern Highbush</i>	6 ft tall x 6 ft wide	Early Season	Needs pollination Use Biloxi as a pollinator.	Large, light colored, firm berries. Excellent flavor.
Jubilee <i>Southern Highbush</i>	5-6 ft tall x 5-6 wide	Mid Season	Needs pollination. Doesn't pollinate well with Northland.	Medium to large, sky blue, very sweet fruit. Performs well is heavier soils through summer heat.
Sunshine Blue <i>Southern Highbush</i>	3-4 ft tall x 3-4 ft wide	Mid/Late May	Self-pollinating	Firm, good quality berries. Perfect for small gardens and large containers.
O'Neal <i>Southern Highbush</i>	4-6 ft tall x 4-6 ft wide	Early Season	Needs pollination	Large, medium blue, attractive fruit.
Georgiagem <i>Southern Highbush</i>	5-6 ft tall x 4-6 ft wide	Early/Mid Season	Needs pollination	Medium to large, very firm fruit. Excellent flavor and color.
Bluegold <i>Northern Highbush</i>	4-5 ft tall x 4-5 ft wide	Late Season	Needs pollination	Medium size, light blue, and firm fruit. Retains high quality for up to 5 weeks in storage.
Bluejay <i>Northern Highbush</i>	5-7 ft tall x 3-4 ft wide	Mid Season	Needs pollination. Pollinate with Northland	Medium to large, firm, smooth, and light blue fruit. Mild, slightly tart flavor. Good desert quality.
Northland <i>Northern Highbush</i>	3-4 ft tall x 3-4 ft wide	Mid Season	Needs pollination. Doesn't pollinate well with Jubilee.	Small, round, medium firm, dark blue berries. Wild blueberry flavor. Best for fresh eating. Best for the landscape and very soil tolerant.
Blueray <i>Northern Highbush</i>	4-6 ft tall x 3-4 ft wide	Early/Mid Season	Self-pollinating. Fine pollinator for Bluecrop and Northblue.	Large, medium blue fruit. Very sweet, slightly tart, aromatic flavor. Great for home gardens-very productive. Heat tolerance.
Bluecrop <i>Northern Highbush</i>	4-6 ft tall x 3-4 ft wide	Mid Season	Self-pollinating	Large to very large, firm, and bright light blue fruit. Good for fresh eating, preserves, baking and freezing. Red fall color.
Northblue <i>Half Highbush</i>	20-30 in tall x 20-40 in wide	Mid/Late Season	Self-pollinating. Yields improve when planted with Northcountry.	Plump, firm, sweet, .5 inch navy blue fruit. Excellent wild blueberry flavor. Easy to pick. Good for fresh use.
Northcountry <i>Half Highbush</i>	18-24 in tall x 30-40 in wide	Mid/Late Season	Needs pollination	Medium size, .5 inch diameter, sky blue fruit. Sweet to mild, wild blueberry flavor. Excellent landscape plant.
Darrow <i>Northern Highbush</i>	5-6 ft tall x 5-6 ft wide	Late Season	Self-pollinating	Large, firm, light blue, loose fruit cluster. Tart until completely ripe, then excellent flavor.

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Patriot <i>Northern Highbush</i>	4-6 ft tall x 4-5 ft wide	Mid Season	Needs pollination	Large, slightly flat, medium blue berries. Tolerates wet or clay soils well.
Duke <i>Northern Highbush</i>	4-8 ft tall x 4-6 ft wide	Early Season	Self-pollinating	Medium size, firm, light blue berries. Mild flavor.
Elliot <i>Northern Highbush</i>	5-8 ft tall x 5-8 ft wide	Very Late Season	Self-pollinating	Small to medium, firm, light blue berries. Good, mild flavor when fully ripe.
Pink Lemonade <i>Northern Highbush</i>	4-5 ft tall x 4-5 ft wide	Mid/Late Season	Self-pollinating	Deep pink, firm fruit. Sweet and mild flavor.
Reka <i>Northern Highbush</i>	4-6 ft tall x 4 ft wide	Mid Season	Needs pollination	Medium size, medium blue, firm fruit. Grows well in light sandy soils, peat, and heavier clay soils.
Spartan <i>Northern Highbush</i>	5-6 ft tall x 4-5 ft wide	Mid Season	Needs pollination	Large to very large, firm, powdery light blue fruit. Excellent flavor. Superb fresh or in pies.
Northsky <i>Half Highbush</i>	10-18 in tall x 24-36 in wide	Mid Season	Needs pollination	Small to medium, sky blue fruit. Excellent wild blueberry flavor.
Chippewa <i>Half Highbush</i>	3-4 ft tall x 304 ft wide	Mid Season	Needs pollination	Medium to large, very light blue, firm fruit. Very sweet flavor.
Ornablue <i>Half Highbush</i>	3 ft tall x 3 ft wide	Mid Season	Needs pollination	Small, dark blue fruits.
Polaris <i>Half Highbush</i>	4 ft tall x 3 ft wide	Mid/Late Season	Needs pollination	Medium size, very firm, light blue fruit. Highly aromatic flavor.
Tophat <i>Lowbush</i>	16-24 in tall x 12-24 in wide	Mid Season	Self-pollinating	Medium/Large, firm, sweet, bright, light blue berries. Good flavor. Perfect for containers
Premier <i>Rabbiteye</i>	6-10 ft tall 5-8 ft wide	Early Season	Needs pollination	Large, light blue fruit. Stores well.
Climax <i>Rabbiteye</i>	6-10 ft tall spreading	Early Season	Needs pollination.	Medium to large, medium dark blue fruit. Sweet flavor.
Tifblue <i>Rabbiteye</i>	8-14 ft tall	Mid Season	Needs pollination. Pollinate with Woodard.	Medium to large, firm, light powder blue fruit. Sweet and highly flavored. Most cold hardy of rabbiteye.
Woodard <i>Rabbiteye</i>	3-4 ft tall	Early Season	Needs pollination. Pollinate with Tiftblue.	Large to very large, light to medium blue fruit. Medium to firm flesh. Aromatic with a touch of tartness. Excellent for the home garden.
Peach Sorbet™ <i>Brazelberries®</i>	2 ft tall x 2 ft wide	Mid Season	Needs pollination	Large berries. Foliage colors ranging from vibrant peach and pink to lime and emerald in the spring to a dramatic eggplant purple in the winter.
Jelly Bean™ <i>Brazelberries®</i>	1-2 ft tall x 1-2 ft wide	Mid Season	Needs pollination	Super sweet flavor. Excellent for planting in containers.
